Project:

- What is the likelihood that the situation involves sensitive, rare, or irreplaceable natural resources?
- What is the likelihood that the situation involves sensitive, rare, or irreplaceable cultural resources?
- What is the likelihood of imminent and significant changes to the natural or cultural resources?
- What is the likelihood of 4 imminent and significant changes to visitor experience?
- How will the issue affect other aspects of land management in the area or surrounding areas?
 - What is the geographic extent of the issue's impacts? Scales of impacts include: national, regional, state, local/county, and site or project.

What is the relative interest of stakeholders affected by the action? Stakeholders may include: local communities, general public, special interest groups,

- local communities, general public, special interest groups, recreational visitors, commercial users, traditional-subsistence users, tribes, and others.
- 8 Is the impact temporary (low) or long lasting (high)?
